

- a) Scribes and Pharisees = keepers, copiers, teachers, and tradition holders (Torah)
- b) Jesus "You found the key but you failed to open the door."
- c) I need to catch something they missed if I would enter God's kingdom.
- *This calls for me to **examine** my life.

Jesus' message on the mountain describes God's expectations (impossibly high). It also tells of the joy and reward of those who seek his kingdom and righteousness.

- standards of true salvation
- <u>character</u> of those who are truly saved
- impact of those who are truly saved

Righteousness of RULES vs. Righteousness of HEART

HUMILITY that weeps over the SELF

It is only when I <u>hunger</u> for his nature and <u>abandon</u> my self centeredness (pride) that I enter his kingdom and experience his life

EXPECTATIONS that rise above the CULTURE

Light and **darkness** are **different**.

BEHAVIOR that goes beyond the RULES

Laws are simply the <u>minimal</u> <u>expectation</u>. They are a <u>starting</u> point rather than a <u>stopping</u> place.

WORSHIP that moves past the FORM

Human forms and norms, applause or approval is <u>irrelevant</u>.

FAITH that reaches beyond the EARTH

Pursuit of earthly resources and rewards is **not** my **priority**.

WISDOM that sees beneath the SURFACE

Obedience to God is the foundation of kingdom living. Two houses may be identical except for their foundations, yet that one **difference** is **crucial**.
