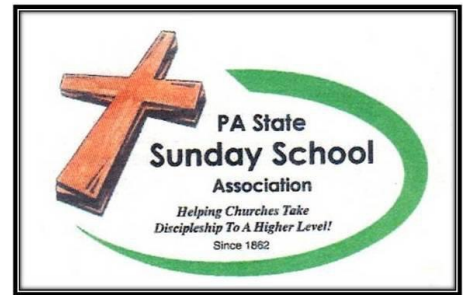

WHY DO YOU HONOR YOUR SONS MORE THAN ME?

(I Samuel 2)

As adults, Eli could not force his sons to _____ their _____ or _____. However, as “the priest” (1:9) of Shiloh, in charge of tabernacle and ark (4:4, 12-13), Eli had the _____ of _____ for that entire system of worship and sacrifice. He could have relieved them of their duties (both as discipline and deterrence). In allowing them to continue, Eli _____ in their sacrilege (2:29 ... “you” is plural). Though it was the wickedness of his sons, God saw it as the “guilt of Eli’s house” (3:14). In allowing his sons to behave wickedly within _____ of _____, Eli was honoring his sons more than God. (3:13).

The purpose of discipline is not simply to “stop bad behavior” but to instill respect for wisdom, righteousness, and justice (Prov. 1:3). The NT describes 4 aspects of discipline toward the goal of “equipping (the person) for every good work” (II Tim. 3:16-17)
