

BROKEN LAWS (GUILT)

"break" literally = object symbolically = nonphysical reality break = <u>destroying</u> something <u>good</u>
<u>dishonoring</u> something <u>important</u>
<u>disregarding</u> a <u>custom/standard/law</u>

sometimes = <u>courage</u> often = <u>conceit</u>

Arrogance, conceit, egotism ...

- Acting as if something important is unimportant or nonexistent
- Acting as if my own desire is a higher value than the value of law/tradition/object

Moral awareness of guilt = sense of debt

Emotional awareness of guilt = sense of shame

Spiritual awareness of guilt = sense of culpability

BROKENESS is not HOPELESSNESS

You do not delight in sacrifice, or I would bring it ... The sacrifices of God are a broken spirit. A broken and contrite heart, O God, you will not despise.

(Psalm 51:16-17)

Numbers 5:5-10 (Leviticus 5:1-7)

- broken <u>trust/peace</u> with fellowman "wrongs"
 - broken <u>expectations/relations</u> with God "unfaithful"
 - •broken <u>conscience/confidence</u> of self "guilty"

Numbers 5:5-10 FIX

- repair the <u>deception/dishonesty</u>
 "confess"
- repay the <u>debt/obligation</u> as possible "restitution"

asham = guilt AND guilt offering

Every effort must be made to <u>pay</u> the <u>debt</u>. HOWEVER, this is often <u>impossible</u>

Forgive us our DEBTS as we also have forgiven our DEBTORS ... for if you forgive men their SIN against you, your heavenly Father will also forgive you. (Matthew 6:12, 14)

The NT describes sin as debt (in the same way the OT described guilt as debt). However, there is no equivalent word for asham (guilt > guilt offering). The idea of making restitution (to God) has vanished.

CHRIST paid all debt **past** and **future** in our behalf.

... as if no law was <u>ever broken</u> [justification]

AMAZING!
