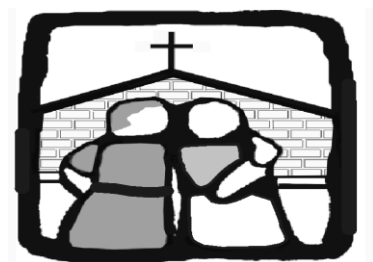

SKIN

If our body has a **front line**, it is our skin. It is out there leading the way, hovering and covering, performing and informing, clutching and touching ... day and night. An amazing, living membrane, it enables us to caress our world!

VISIBILITY Skin provides a _____, an attractive surface, which is the seat of our impressions and memories of each other. Nerve impulse and oxygen transfer are invisible. But skin can be seen and touched. It provides appearance, approachability, and believability. God “took on skin” in order to be tangible to us.

ADAPTABILITY Skin is able to flow around whatever surface it contacts, enabling both grip and transfer of pressure. Its elasticity allows movement. Its compliancy allows for any shape or pressure. Its viscosity cushions bones, prevents pressure points, and absorbs impact. It is both _____ and _____.

PROTECTION As a barrier of the body, skin keeps the outside “out” and the “inside” in. Without it, we would lose our definition and integrity as an organism. It _____ the external world! Waterproof covering. Shield against dirt, bacteria, and poison. And it _____ the internal world! It prevents evaporation of internal fluids or dissipates heat by rushing fluids to its surface (sweat) to evaporate and cool us down.

PROXIMITY Eyes and ears can provide information from a distance. Skin must be immediate to its stimuli in order to inform of danger or pleasure. It monitors wind, particles, temperature, humidity, radiation, pressure, etc. Rolled thin like pie dough, studded with half a million tiny transmitters, pasted around the surface of our entire body, it gives a steady supply of information.
