\*Also used to describe the reality of an experience. A way of saying that it is not intellectual or theoretical but experiential. Personal. Real

Surely God has denied me justice.

Jesus said, “Some who are standing here will not TASTE death until they see the kingdom of God coming in power.” *(Mark 9:1)*

tongue tastes food? (*Job 12:11*)

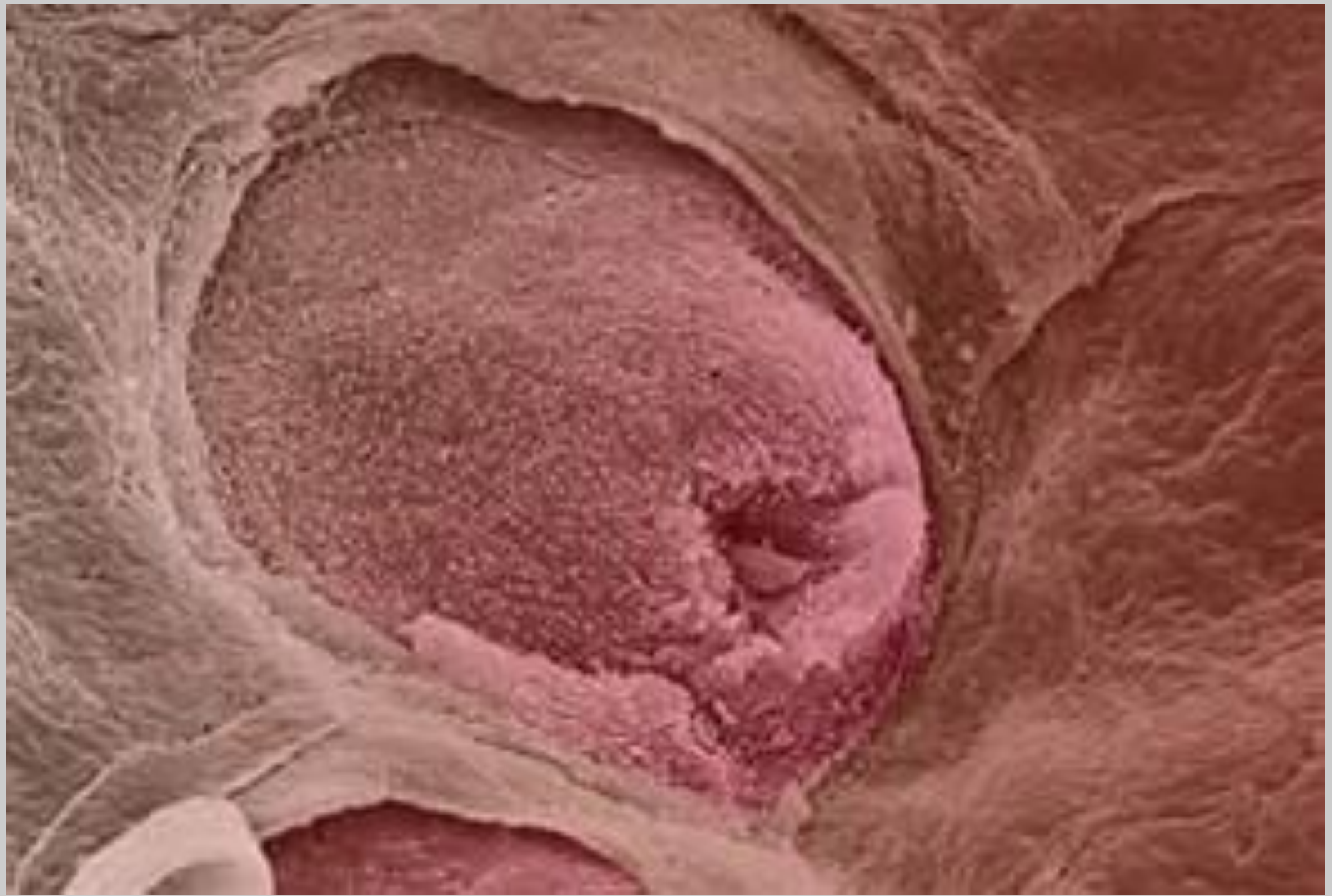
They offered him wine to drink, mixed with gall. But after TASTING it, he refused to drink it. (*Matthew 27:34*)

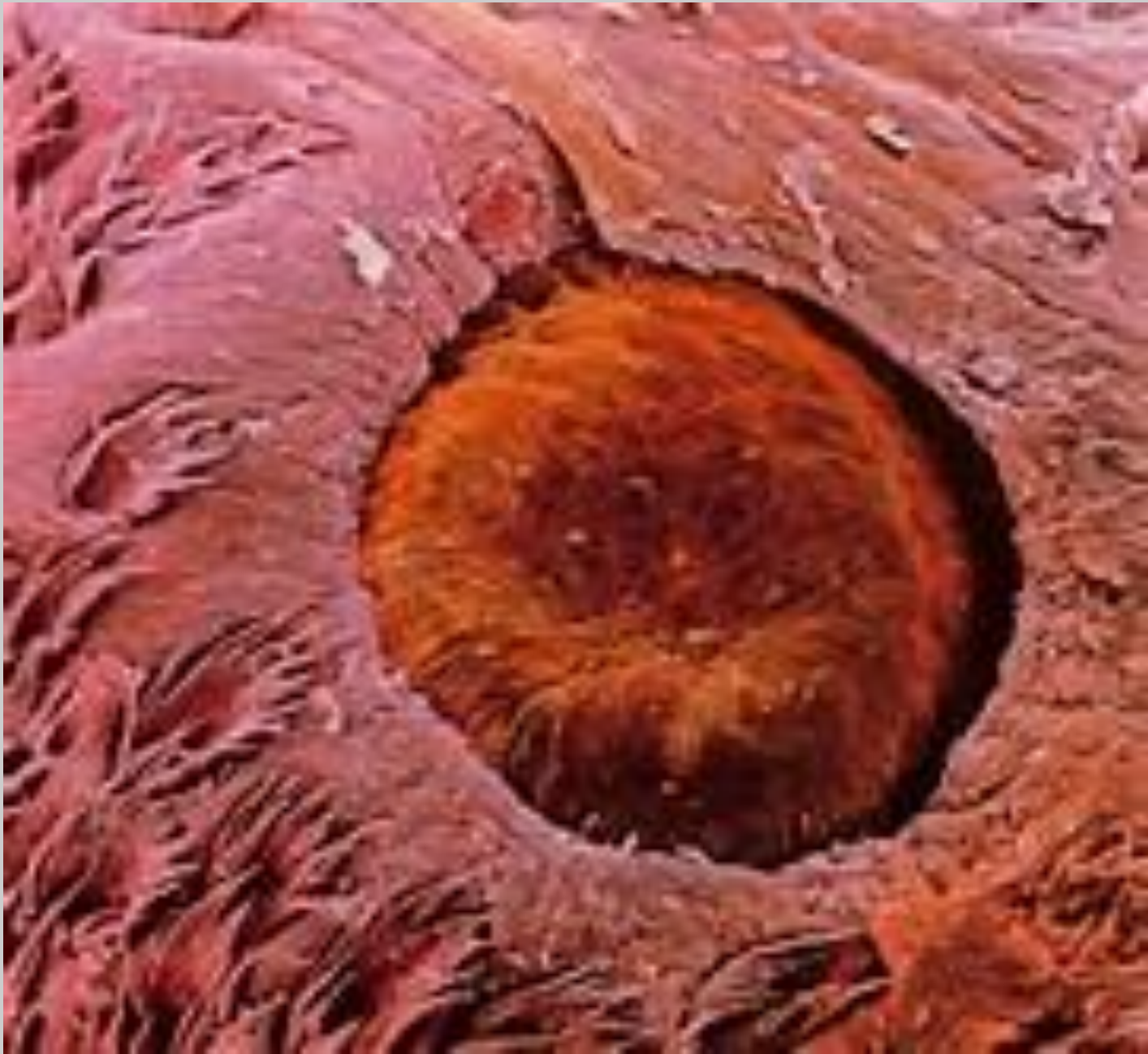


The master of the banquet TASTED
