Q = Is it acceptable to divorce your partner? (vs. 3)

A = NO. You (or any other person) must not separate what God has joined. (vs. 6)

The STANDARD of marriage applies until death occurs

(excuses) - age

- emotion/lust
- anger
- no emotional attachment
- mutual agreement

The STANDARD of marriage should motivate couples to fix any brokenness in the marriage.

A wife must not separate from her husband. But if she does, she must remain unmarried or else be reconciled to her husband. And a husband must not divorce his wife.

(1 Cor. 7:10-11)

If a man marries a woman who becomes displeasing to him because he finds something indecent about her, and he writes her a certificate of divorce and sends her away from his house, and if after she leaves his house she becomes the wife of another (Duet. 24:1-2) man...

Moses was <u>regulating</u> something, but he was not <u>authorizing</u> or <u>sanctioning</u> it.

Moses was seeking to keep <u>one</u> wrong from becoming two wrongs.

Moses = adultery... <u>must be</u> <u>executed</u> (*Duet. 22:22*)

Jesus = adultery... may be divorced (Mt. 5:32, 19:9)

Moses = Upon divorce, remarriage is anticipated (Duet. 24:1-2)

Jesus = Upon divorce and remarriage, the perpetrator is guilty of adultery (Mt. 10:11-12) The victim (nonresponsible) is caused to commit adultery. (Mt. 5:32)
