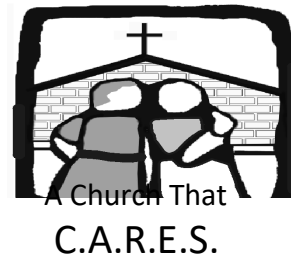

Even when the room and rules were used properly, the separation/awkwardness/fear remained. THE CURTAIN STILL HUNG THERE, a symbolic barrier. Sins were not actually forgiven and consciences were not actually cleansed. These formalities simply bought time ... a _____.
