- 4. Do not listen to others. Do all the talking yourself! This helps folks realize and accept your superiority.
- 5. Avoid small groups, especially at church. They are dangerous for the unfriendly person! Folks will seek to get close to you. Could break down resistance.
- 6. Never take the first step toward a relationship. If you don't know a person's name, do not talk to them!
 - 7. Avoid praying for others. This is not directly being "friendly" but may lead down that path. The less you care the more unfriendly you can remain.
