The LORD is my shepherd, there is nothing I lack. (Holman)

The LORD is my shepherd, I have everything that I need. (NLT)

The LORD is my shepherd, I shall not be in want. (NIV)

## If the LORD is my shepherd, my most significant is **covered**.

My "want" list may be long, but my actual "need" list is quite short.

My most crucial, necessary need in life lies in the **spiritual** realm.

Do not be afraid of those who can kill the body, but cannot kill the soul. Rather, be afraid of the one who can destroy both body and soul in hell. (Matthew 10:28)

What will it be for a man if he gains the whole world, yet forfeits his soul? What can a man give in exchange for his soul? (Matthew 16:26)

#### SPIRITUAL. I need to be <u>prepared</u> to <u>die</u>.

Man is destined to die once, and after that to face judgments.

(Hebrews 9:27)

We have this hope [sacrifice of Christ] as an anchor for the SOUL. (Hebrews 6:19)

Even if all my physical/material needs are perpetually met, this need <u>remains</u>.

#### Other needs (mental or emotional)

LONELINESS

PURPOSE

PEACE

IF YOU ALLOW THE LORD TO BE YOUR SHEPHERD, He will meet those needs.

# The Lord will **fill** the emptiness, **still** the restlessness, and **thrill** the paralysis.

The shepherd's entire <u>instinct</u>, <u>intention</u>, and <u>interest</u> is the **WELL BEING** of its animal.

Toward this end the shepherd <u>watches</u>, <u>worries</u>, and <u>works</u>.

### This ANALOGY is a description of God's role **over** my life.

The ANALOGY implies my need to **acknowledge** and **trust** God as the one who will meet all my needs.

For you were like sheep going astray, but now have returned to the Shepherd and Overseer of your souls.

(1 Peter 2:25)

This poem was written by David who WAS a shepherd prior to his career as soldier and politician. Understanding the responsibility, authority, and unpredictability of that role gave him an appreciation for it. But knowing the vulnerability and weakness of a sheep gave him the keen realization that he needed a shepherd for his humanity. His choice was personal and sincere. "The Lord is my shepherd."
