APOLOGETICS

- 1. Arguments on **behalf** of the Christian faith
- 2. Arguments regarding the <u>necessity</u> of the Christian faith
- 3. Arguments <u>against</u> views incompatible with the Christian faith

APOLOGETIC (Greek origin) signified a speech in someone's defense in a court of law.

An "apologist" thinks along these lines...

Personal <u>CONVICTION</u> of the reality/exclusivity/necessity of the Christian gospel (truth!)

2. Personal **OBEDIENCE** to the Biblical instruction to "defend/contend" the faith

"Dear friends... I felt I had to write and urge you to contend for the faith that was once and for all entrusted to the saints." (Jude 3) 3. Personal <u>COMPASSION</u> for folks headed toward God's wrath through ignorance or stubborness

REALITY. Many folks refuse to consider the gospel seriously unless they are presented with **evidence** of its truthfulness.

REALITY. Many Christians are weak, careless, doubtful, and easily led astray by <u>objections</u> from unbelievers!

SEVERAL CORE ISSUES...

- GOD (existence)?
- Bible (mythology, lunacy, or revelation)?
- Mankind (fallen nature or social injustice or mental illness)?
- Hell/Heaven (reality of afterlife/reward)?
- HELPER/SAVIOR (intervention/justice vs. mercy)?
- Jesus Christ (identify/purpose/accomplishment)? **ETC**.

"Always be ready to give an ANSWER/REASON/DEFENCE (apologia) to anyone who asks you about the hope that is within you."

(1 Peter 3:15)

It is vital that we boldly declare the reasons and logic and truth that **compel** us to **believe**.
