We assess or "judge" people using any and every criteria available.

We cannot escape assessment of people or having <u>preferences</u> or personal <u>favorites</u>.

It is not wrong to feel an <u>affinity</u> or <u>attraction</u> to one person more than another.

FAVORITISM

(literally – "lifting up the face" vs. 1)

I don't want or seek to know someone simply because I <u>already</u> have <u>friends</u>. (avoidance)

I <u>manipulate</u> <u>circumstances</u> so that opportunity is more/less available. (exploitation)

I withhold time/resources simply because I do not **enjoy** someone's **personality.** (prejudice)

I treat folks <u>differently</u> (favorably/unfavorably) based on external factors. (discrimination)

"Since you call on a Father who judges each man's WORK impartially ..." (I Peter 1:17)

"Man looks upon the outward appearance, but God looks upon the heart" (I Sam. 6:17)

vs. 4 – judges with evil thoughts

JUDGES (civil/criminal) are <u>expected</u> to base verdicts on <u>behavior</u> rather than <u>appearance</u>.

What factor is God's **love/value** based upon?

God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that WHOEVER (literally = everyone which) believes in him will not perish but have everlasting life. (John 3:16)

What factor should our **love/value** be based upon?

If you keep the royal law found in Scripture, "Love your neighbor as yourself," you are doing right. (James 2:8)

INSTINCT sees a <u>particularity</u>. LOVE sees a <u>person</u>.

We cannot help but notice differences between people. **SO WHAT?**

Noticing a characteristic is a DIFFERENT REALITY from choosing a behavior.

Behavioral response to external (nonmoral) differences? We should be OBLIVIOUS.

BECAUSE

- ✓ We are motivated <u>by</u> the Lord (not the person).
- ✓ We are performing our service <u>unto</u> the Lord (not the person).
