Carving through the heart of the Promised Land is the Biblical spine of Israel, sometimes referred to as the "Path of the Patriarchs" and officially designated as "Route 60." A highway of deep historical significance while often the scene of unrest and violence, this 146-mile road of asphalt and concrete begins in Nazareth, Israel's largest Arab city, and ends in Beersheba, one of Israel's hi-tech centers.

Running North to South, Route 60 connects ancient Israel with modern Israel, Jews and Christians with Muslims, and Israelis with Palestinians. This trek is far more than a two-lane highway; It is a historic, sacred link to the roots of Judaism and Christianity and the stories of the Old and New Testaments

### THIS IS MY BODY

### **Cremation?**

The Bible gives no specified directions to Christians regarding the disposal of a dead body. While there are positive and negative aspects to both cremation and burial, neither practice has <u>spiritual</u> significance. The Jews of Palestine had burial "customs" (Jn. 19:40) yet also practiced cremation as evidenced by many urns containing ashes discovered by archeology. The state of one's remains is <u>relatively</u> unimportant and this issue does not need to be a great focus or worry (*Lk.* 9:59-60)

OT Purification Ritual An innocent animal, slaughtered and burned, had its ashes (representing its innocence) substituted for and applied to the unclean person (Num. 19, Ps. 51:7, Heb. 9:13-14). This was not a pagan ceremony but one prescribed and directed by the Lord.

Fire is a scriptural symbol of judgment (Josh. 7:15, Ps. 78:21), and pagan people <u>have</u> burned their dead bodies. However, fire is also a Scriptural image of holiness (11 ki. 2:11, 6:17), power (Acts 2:1-4), and purity (1 Cor. 3:12-15). And God-fearing folks have cremated bodies as an expression of honor and respect (1 Sam. 31:8-13).

Every dead body will disintegrate (Gen. 3:19). Cremation merely accelerates the process. Each person/family must determine the manner of arrangement that expresses their respect and does not damage their own conscience or faith (Rom. 14:22-23). \*God is able to restore any body, no matter what manner of death or decay, giving every believer a renewed and perfected body at the resurrection (1 Cor. 15:52).

<sup>\*</sup>While some paradigms of thought (Hindu, Buddhist) teach a future existence of spirit only or other forms, Jewish/Christian teaching has always been a future where the SOUL inhabits a BODY. (It is in this sense that the body's death is referred to as "sleep"). (Is. 26:19, Dan. 12:2-3, Jn. 5:28-29, Rom. 8:18-24).
