### **OCEAN of EMOTION**

#### THE HEART vs. THE DEED

The Fun House with the fat mirror, skinny mirror, and blob mirror. Hilarious! But not real. It looks real because: • the mirror \_\_\_\_\_\_• I see what the mirror \_\_\_\_\_\_. Words and deeds reveal a person's heart. Or do they? Not always! Affected by "weaknesses" (*Rom. 8:26 Heb. 4:15*), words/deeds may <u>not</u> reflect the true identity or intention of the heart. Therefore, they are not always a reliable indicator and must be responded to carefully. Forgiveness can be \_\_\_\_\_\_\_ in the \_\_\_\_\_\_\_ it will cut through the "distortion" and reach the heart. • Believer (*1 Jn. 3:1-2, 20*) • Non-believer (*Lk. 23:34*)

#### <u>John 20:23</u>

This verse is usually understood as permission to recognize or announce (with authority!) that sins are forgiven (or not!) based upon the attitude of the "sinner." Repentant? YES. Not repentant? NO. It conveys permission to be God's spokesman. However, its simple language conveys something different.

It describes the power of your choice to hold on or let go of "sins." No input from the sinner is mentioned. Their request cannot make you forgive and their silence cannot keep you from forgiving.

• The future effect \_\_\_\_\_\_ you of past sins \_\_\_\_\_ you is a matter \_\_\_\_\_ you!

#### THEOLOGY

1. Man's sin > God's anger > Christ's death > God's forgiveness = \_\_\_\_\_.

(Heb. 9:22, 10-18)

2. Both remedy (sacrifice) and offer (forgiveness) = God's \_\_\_\_\_.

(Rom. 5:6-8)

3. This \_\_\_\_\_\_ places upon every Christian believer the \_\_\_\_\_\_ of seeking advocating and pursuing forgiveness (reconciliation) in all ways possible, whether they are victim or mediator (*Mt. 5:38-48, 18:35, 11 Cor. 5:18-20*). God is in the FORGIVENESS business. Which makes it our business also! (*Act 2:38, 10:43, 13:38, Eph. 4:3*)
