GOVERNMENT

In the world but not OF the world

Government is God's AUTHORITY delegated to those whose time/work are given to **leadership**, **organization**, and **security** of a population (county, country, etc.) in order that those people may live **productive** and **peaceful** lives (*Rom.* 13:1-2, 6)

(Kom. 15.1-2, 0)
• A Christian cannot be an anarchist. We must thankfully the <u>role</u> of government and for its success and its pursuit of righteous goals (1 Tim. 2:1-3).
• A Christian should to government's laws (Rom. 13:1, Titus 3:1-2) as long as such laws favor <u>right</u> and punish <u>wrong</u> , defining right/wrong on God's terms (Rom. 13:3-4).
SCRIPTURE: Philippians 3:18-20 Citizens of heaven 1 Peter 2:11 Aliens and strangers on earth PRINCIPLE: Cooperation as long as there is no (Rom. 6:11) Participation as long as and are not overridden (Rom. 14:22-23)
WHEN GOVERNMENT CLAIMS GOD'S AUTHORITY BUT CONTRADICTS GOD'S MORAL VALUES? 1. A Christian's loyalty to government is always, bound up with the government's commitment to God's values. (Ex. 1:15-21).
2. Protest and civil disobedience is a Christian response to laws or government (Dan. 3:1-18, Acts 4:17-20, 6:29). Prison or martyrdom is preferable to the Christian over disobedience to God in order to a (Mt. 5:10-12, Rev. 6:9, 12:10-11).
*It has never been God's intention to build or protect his Kingdom through human government (Jn. 18:36). Governments change society from the outside (laws) and work best when those laws reflect God's intentions (1 Peter 2:14). However, the focus of Christian living and testimony is the power of God to change individuals from the inside (11 Cor. 5:17). We must not expect government to do what can only be done through Christian preaching and godly living.
